On June 3, 1899, the day that Esterhazy's confession appeared in the Paris papers, the government decided to bring Dreyfus back from Devil's Island for a new court martial. Dreyfus had been in prison for four-and-a-half years. Dreyfus' second court martial was probably the world's first big media event.

The Dreyfus Affair. He was formally accused of treason, demonized, insulted and arrested. The events of his life had a profound effect on European and Jewish affairs. Indeed, his name has become synonymous with "scapegoat.". Despite the lack of hard evidence supporting his guilt, he was stripped of his military rank, sentenced to deportation, and caused to suffer tremendously—just because he was Jewish.

The Dreyfus Affair - (1894-1906) - Jewish History

Suspicion quickly fell upon Dreyfus, who was arrested for treason on 15 October 1894. On 5 January 1895, Dreyfus was summarily convicted in a secret court martial, publicly stripped of his army rank, and sentenced to life imprisonment on Devil's Island in French Guiana.

The investigators quickly concluded that the hand- writing on the note, known as the bordereau, belonged to Dreyfus, and he was arrested on 15 October and charged with treason. Dreyfus was court-martialed and convicted in December, and sentenced to life in prison.
