The result is a mass of abnormal cells, which forms a tumor. In adults, primary brain tumors are much less common than are secondary brain tumors, in which cancer begins elsewhere and spreads to the brain. Many different types of primary brain tumors exist. Each gets its name from the type of cells involved.

Meningiomas account for about 1 out of 3 primary brain and spinal cord tumors. They are the most common primary brain tumors in adults (although strictly speaking, they are not actually brain tumors). The risk of these tumors increases with age. They occur about twice as often in women.

### **Types of Brain Tumors and Spinal Cord Tumors in Adults**

Metastatic brain cancer, also called secondary brain cancer, occurs when cancer spreads to the brain from another part of the body. It's about ten times more common than primary brain cancer, which starts in the brain.. Each year, about 100,000 people in the United States are diagnosed with brain metastases.

Symptoms of adult brain tumors, many of which are non-specific and occur in other diseases, may include headaches, nausea, vomiting, speech, hearing or vision changes, memory problems, personality changes and paresthesias (an abnormal sensation of the skin such as numbness, tingling, prickling, burning, or creeping on the skin that has no objective cause), and seizures.

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
