Guidelines for Case Presentations - Charlotte AHEC

Case Context and Method: Describe the treatment setting, relevant context, and sources of "data" (e.g., case notes, audio- or videotaped sessions, patient or therapist self-report measures, diaries or other reporting forms, information from significant others, clinical records, therapist reflections, etc.). Describe the precautions that were taken to prevent disclosure of the client's identity, and whether the client consented to publication.

Writing a Clinical Vignette (Case Report) Abstract Case reports represent the oldest and most familiar form of medical communication. Far from a "second-class" publication, many original observations are first presented as case reports. Like scientific abstracts, the case report abstract is governed by rules that dictate its format and length.

Effective presentations require that you have thought through the case beforehand and understand the rationale for your conclusions and plan. This, in turn, requires that you have a good grasp of physiology, pathology, clinical reasoning and decision-making - pushing you to read, pay attention, and in general acquire more knowledge.

Patients with a mild clinical presentation (absence of viral pneumonia and hypoxia) may not initially require hospitalization, and many patients will be able to manage their illness at home. The decision to monitor a patient in the inpatient or outpatient setting should be made on a case-by-case basis.

When constructing a clinical case presentation, the stem includes a patient vignette. Components of a patient vignette are below: Age, Gender (e.g., A 45-year-old man) Site of Care (e.g., comes to the emergency department)

Guidelines for Writing Case Presentations

Background (1-2 sentences) —First, explain why this case is being reported and its novelty or clinical relevance. 2. Case presentation (3-6 sentences) —give a brief description of the patient’s medical and demographic details, their diagnosis, and interventions or complications, and the outcomes.

A case presentation is a narrative of a patient’s care, so it is vital the presenter has familiarity with the patient, the case and its progression. The preparation for the presentation will depend on what information is to be included. Generally, oral case presentations are brief and should be limited to 5–10 minutes.

How to make an oral case presentation to healthcare ...

Clinical findings include nausea, vomiting, rash, aches and pains, a positive tourniquet test, leukopenia, and the following warning signs: abdominal pain or tenderness, persistent vomiting, clinical fluid accumulation, mucosal bleeding, lethargy, restlessness, and liver enlargement.

In the context of the medical case presentation, the salient genre prior to it is the history-taking activity more commonly known as the medical interview in consultations. The contrast between the two genres of the history-taking interview and the OCP is sharp - one is a dyadic semi-formal conversation and the other a formal monologue report.

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
