Craft a few questions to assess each skill you're looking for.

Ask One Question at a Time: Avoid multi-part questions; they will only overwhelm the employer. Each question should have one specific point. Avoid "Yes" or "No" Questions: Most questions with a "yes," "no," or another one-word answer could likely be answered by searching the company's website.

Standardized, open-ended interview - here, the same open-ended questions are asked to all interviewees (an open-ended question is where respondents are free to choose how to answer the question, i.e., they don't select "yes" or "no" or provide a numeric rating, etc.); this approach facilitates faster interviews that can be more easily analyzed and compared.

General Guidelines for Conducting Research Interviews

Don't ask questions about convictions for roles that are not security sensitive or ask about convictions that have no connection to the role. For example asking a receptionist about speeding convictions. Rejecting candidates purely on conviction record has been shown to disproportionately

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impact some racial groups.

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
