1. Obtain a bachelor's degree and complete common prerequisite courses. Generally, it takes about four years to get a bachelor's degree, but some future PAs take an additional year to ensure that PA school prerequisites are completed. Consider majoring in a science-based field; your required coursework will count towards PA school prereqs.

To become a physician assistant, one must earn a bachelor's degree, which takes roughly four years, and complete a physician assistant training program, which takes two years. Many physician assistants enter their training programs with experience working in health care (as a nurse or paramedic, for example), and that can add years to the timeline as well.

How to Become a Physician Assistant

To become a physician assistant-certified (PA-C), graduates must pass the Physician Assistant National Certifying Exam (PANCE), administered by the National Commission on Certification of

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Physician Assistants (NCCPA). They must also obtain a state license in order to practice, and complete 100 hours of continuing medical education every two years.

To become a PA, you'll need to earn a master's degree from a PA training program that has received accreditation from the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant (ARC-PA). These programs typically take three academic years.
