If the nursing is taking multiple times but the pup is still crying, it's a sign that your mother dog is not lactating enough. Also, if the pups aren't gaining weight (which should take place dramatically in their first few days of life) you should ask the help of a vet. The hind teats of a lactating or nursing mother dog are the best place to put such puppies in the litter. When the mother gets sick — If the mother has some bad health condition, it usually means she will be unable to feed her puppies properly.

When a mother dogs whelps, or gives birth, her body produces an adequate supply of milk to feed her litter. She also has a natural instinct of when to wean her pups, or gradually cut them off from her milk supply, typically when the pups are 5-6 weeks old.

Bring food to the mother dog. Place food near the mother dog so that she doesn't have to leave the puppies to eat. Many new mothers don't want to leave their puppies to eat, so they abstain from eating for too long after giving birth. However, you can allow your dog to wait a little while to eat.
